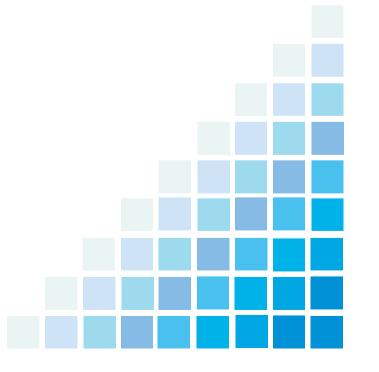

What can I do to help?

We have a range of volunteering opportunities available at both sites including:
