



Respiratory unit

The lung division is based across both sites. We treat patients with chronic lung infections, fibrosing lung disease, cystic fibrosis, occupational lung disease and sleep disorders.



The respiratory unit looks after patients with lung disease, including severe asthma, cystic fibrosis, acute and chronic respiratory failure, patients with sleep disordered breathing and occupational and environmental lung disease, pulmonary fibrosis, chronic lung infections. We offer a variety of treatments not available





elsewhere; many patients receive lifelong care with us, allowing us to build close relationships while we support them to develop their self-care skills.

Victoria Ward

Victoria Ward cares for patients with acute and chronic respiratory conditions, specialising in high dependency care, nasal ventilation, neuromuscular lung disorders, sleep disordered breathing and other respiratory diseases. We have the largest home ventilation support programme in the UK.

Foulis Ward

Foulis Ward cares for patients with a range of lung conditions. Our main focus is cystic fibrosis and bronchiectasis.

Lind Ward

Lind ward specialises in the care of patients with all types of respiratory conditions, including rarer diseases such as pulmonary fibrosis, severe asthma, cystic fibrosis (CF) and bronchiectasis.



The ward consists of a day unit, five-day unit open Monday to Friday, and the Jane Gray Bronchoscopy Suite.

Shift patterns

- Victoria Early, late, long day and night rotation
- Foulis Long day and night rotation (early late shifts with agreement)
- Lind Early, late, night rotation

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
